Eight people affiliated with the Flatirons Photo Club had a total of 18 photos accepted into the prestigious Louisville Art Association's 24th Annual National Juried Photography Show and Sale from May 30-June 7 at the Louisville Center for the Arts. Eli Vega, an award-winning photographer, author and teacher who was the club's featured speaker in June, was the judge for the show. He noted that 100 images were selected for the show and that 863 images were submitted. The 18 photos accepted from those affiliated with the club represented 18% of accepted images. Winning Artistic Achievement awards were Illene Meyers, for Wild Mushrooms and Autumn Road; Nancy Myer, for Sidelong Impression of a Gerbera Daisy; and Dana Bove, for Fairy Path.
